A LETTER FROM ALL SAINTS'

Hello there!

Well we didn't expect this for Spring did we? Indeed, I didn't expect to be writing to you as I should be still on my sabbatical, but things change.....and our lives certainly have, in so many ways. We in our household are in Week 5 of lockdown, some of you may be in Week 6 or 7 depending on your situation and health concerns. As it was described so many times at the beginning of the pandemic – we live in unprecedented times.

A lovely gentlemen in front of me in the queue waiting outside Aldi commented to me last week 'Well, there's no point complaining, we are all in the same boat aren't we, we just have to get on with it.' I smiled and acknowledged his sentiments, but on reflection I now don't necessarily agree with his words....

We are not all in the same boat. We may be sailing in the same storm, but we are not in the same boat. Some of our ships may be in good working order, others of ours may be leaking and only have one oar....and whilst I know there are some sailors out there, I am of course speaking metaphorically!!! And it seems that others have thought similar to me as I read the following on a Facebook page:

- For some of you, you may have been able to embrace quarantine and the peace and quiet that it brings. You may be loving the time of reflection, of pottering in the garden, having gin on the lawn. For others of you, this may be a time of desperate financial & family crisis. For those of you who live alone you are facing endless loneliness. While for others it is precious family time with children, quality time with spouses, exciting times with new partners.
- Some of you are bringing in extra money with endless overtime, Others are working more hours for less money due to pay cuts or loss in sales. Sadly, some of you may no longer have a job.
- Some of you may have been concerned about getting a certain chocolate for Easter while others were concerned if there would be enough bread, milk and eggs for the weekend.
- Some of our lovely community have experienced the near death of the virus, some have already lost someone from it, and some are not sure if their loved ones are going to make it. Others living around us don't believe this is a big deal and continue to go out and about, ignoring the guidance.

So, friends, we are not in the same boat and I think we need to acknowledge that. We are going through a shared time together but one where our perceptions and needs are completely different....however we are all experiencing suffering in one way or another.

For Christians like me, we have just experienced Easter and all the joy the resurrection of Jesus brings, but I have been drawn back to the section in the bible, where Jesus is with some friends and goes to prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane. It is 'Maundy Thursday', the last supper has just taken place, and Jesus knows he will die soon. In Matthew chapter 26, verses 38 and 39 it says 'Then Jesus said to them, "I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and stay awake with me." ³⁹ And going a little farther, he threw himself on the ground and prayed, "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet not what I want but what you want."

He may have been the Son of God, but Jesus was going through extreme pressure in the Garden that night. And I think we need to be honest with ourselves in that we are all going through extreme pressure – lack of money, loss of job, disconnects with family and friends, trying to home-school our children whilst working 8 hours a day: the list is endless......

None of this is physical illness, they are all mental issues and stresses, but as we all know this type of illness can be as damaging and as painful as any actual injury.

And whilst my message in the magazine is not normally bible centric, I think this experience by Jesus can in a way help us through this pandemic of fear and worry: Jesus chooses to go to the garden:

This was a favourite place of his. Whilst I have not visited my favourite place, the beach, since the lockdown, I have reclaimed a lovely armchair from paperwork, books and jumpers and now I am enjoy spending five minutes or so sitting and being in the chair every day, with the sun coming through the window. So, find somewhere you can peacefully sit and rest there awhile each day.

Jesus took his 3 closest friends with him.

Being separated from family and friends is up there with the hardest thing we have to cope with, but with all the technology available to us it is actually quite easy to keep in contact with one another. This could even be the time to go 'old school' and get out some paper and pen and write some old fashion handwritten letters!

In prayer, Jesus focussed on the goodness of God

It is very easy to fill our mind with dark thoughts, but actually when we look at the beautiful world around us, we have so much to be thankful for: try to remember this every day.

Jesus chose to be radically vulnerable

He asked his friends to stay with him.... He asked God to 'take this cup away' from him. Jesus dared to be vulnerable – how often do we do that? Virtually 'Lean' on your family and friends - don't always put on a brave face, admit your struggles.

I know turning to God is not for everyone, but I wanted to speak from my heart today and that means including my faith. All I wanted was to do was to be honest and try and give you all some hope, some peace and most importantly my love during this challenging period of worry and fear.

Be gentle on yourselves, be kind to each other, be thankful. Most importantly know that not only are the medical professionals and other key workers in my thoughts and prayers, but also each and every one of you, the community I have the honour to serve.

Keep safe, keep well and I look forward to seeing you in the calm, when this storm is over.





Coronavirus Update.

The IW Council and its partners have established a helpline to support residents about the Coronavirus crisis. If you, or somebody that you know requires support please call: 01983 823600 (7 days a week 9am-5pm).

In the meantime myself and CIIr Lora Peacey Wilcox are working as Co-ordinators with IW Community Action to support residents in need. This follows up from thirty local residents offering support. In light of advice, I will be significantly reducing the amount that I am out and about. However, as a key worker I will be delivering Coronavirus Support/ Volunteer Leaflets (and Annual Reports) to residents.

Ideally, under normal circumstances I would prefer to collate all information on to a single paged information sheet. However, this continues to prove difficult due to the fast changing situation concerning advice.

Issues being raised are as follows:

Issues relating to loneliness. Volunteers are in place to contact isolated residents by phone when required.

Issues relating to Financial Support. The Universal Credit helpline continues to struggle with demand following residents losing employment. I'm told this remains a Government priority and extra staff are being redeployed(!)

Testing of Frontline NHS staff. Nurses have contacted me who are urging 'testing' rather than 'isolation' when showing coronavirus symptoms. This is an issue which (I support) Government being lobbied to change.

Issues relating to second home owners. Although restrictions apply for holiday accommodation, concerns have been relayed to 'visitors from London' relocating to the Island during the coronavirus outbreak. Please note despite reduced visitor numbers there are no restrictions to prevent second home owners returning to the Island.

Issues concerning construction work continuing in Baring Road. *I am now advised that work on site has reduced, with the need for social distancing between contractors.*

Updates: Cowes Post Office in the High Street has temporarily closed. This was due to the lack of space to permit social distancing within the shop. Although I requested the IW Council to intervene to support this essential service, it should be remembered that whilst providing a service it is up to the owners to

consider whether it is 1.commercially viable to remain open and 2. Provide the necessary safeguarding for staff and customers. In the coming weeks inevitably businesses, facilities and services will be impacted by coronavirus.

Cowes Community Bus will reduce its level of service from 30th March to operating only on Tuesday and Saturday.

Cowes Medical Centre has in place an econnect service. This allows patients to contact the Medical Centre without the need for phoning. For details, please visit: https://cowesmedicalcentre.webgp.com/

Sail GP.

At the moment Sail GP are still intending to hold their event during Cowes Week (not been postponed at the moment!).

I understand that the site plan, schedule and traffic management plan has been postponed (due to Coronavirus) and will be shared by the organisers after Easter. The meeting scheduled to take place on 2^{nd} April has also been postponed.

Planning Issues.

Planning Applications.

I am advised that although Planning Applications can be submitted electronically by applicants, and these will be available online in the usual way, no new planning applications will be determined for the immediate future.



Because of Government guidance, the Council will not be starting the formal public consultation due to the need for site visits and the erection of notices.

Baring Road Applications.

I have been advised that the two applications one for 4 dwellings, the second for 6 dwellings are like the refused. In response to this, I have requested intervention following trenches being dug in fields.

Westview Road.

An application was received to develop a residential property in Westview Road, Rew Street. The application is outside the Settlement Boundary and will caused concern over precedent. For this reason, I have called in the application, should officers be mindful of approving the scheme.



Because of the exceptional times we are currently in, the IW Council has relaxed planning conditions regarding the delivery of goods to replenish supermarkets and other shops.

Highways Issues.

Carriageway Resurfacing 2020/2021.

Island Roads have advised me of roads 'being considered' for resurfacing next year. These are:

Crossfield Avenue	Grove Road	Terminus Road
Stephenson Road	Egypt Hill	Town Quay
Cross Street Car Park	Denmark Road	Sun Hill
Somerton Park and Ride	Cross Street	Thetis Road





As yet no date has been arranged to resurface **Worsley Road**, Gurnard. However, despite regularly ask that repairs are made good and the roads condition is monitored.

Glen Place junction.

Discussions are ongoing on who's responsibility it is to improve access to and from Glen Pl Worsley Road. Before the coronavirus outbreak, stem were in place to have a face to face m between residents, planners and Island Roads to resolve a way forward.

Rolls Hill/ Road.

An update from the police has been requested concerning action to be taken against speeding motorists.



Crossfield Avenue.

Myself, Cowes West Councillors Cllr Christine Bustin and Cllr Paul Taylor met with Island Roads to address concerns related to parked vehicles and the need for buses needed to mount the pavement exiting Cowes Enterprise College.

Car Parking Charges.

My request to delay the consultation on charging for parking on Gurnard/ Cowes Seafront was accepted and is on hold by the IW Council. Because of the impact charges would have upon businesses through Coronavirus, I suggested that any consultation would be ill-founded and insensitive at this time.

I remain hopeful that the promise of Island Deals, Fair Funding etc., the IW Council will become overtaken by events. However, should the consultation remain pending I will ensure this is well publicised- if not by the Council, by me!

Solent Forum.

The general theme from the meeting was concerning the impact of how **nitrates** (largely through farming) impact upon water quality and the local environment. This has had an adverse impact upon seagrass, and thus impacts upon absorption of carbon. The development of housing upon nitrates entering water courses was also highlighted as an issue, with some Council's aspiring to reduce housing numbers because of this.



Another issue debated at the Forum was (Eco) **Advanced Mooring Systems** and discussions place with harbour authorities, to use these facilities for yachtsmen to protect seagrass and beds in the Solent.

A discussion took place on **coastal archaeology**, from CITiZAN working with community gro Portsmouth, Langstone and Chichester Harbours who are surveying and exploring remains for the shores of these historic heavily defenced waterfronts.

Sewage Discharged into the Sea from outfall, Gurnard

Following a call from a local resident this was reported to the IW Council.

Coincidentally, in recent weeks at the Solent Forum I have spoken to individuals about the is private outfalls and the impact this has upon the river quality, our beaches and the sea.

In the meantime action has been taken, and the situation continues to be monitored.

Environmental and Waste Issues.

Household rubbish bins have been left out after being emptied. This was reported to the Council's Environment Officer.

I have also requested support from the EO on discarded **compostable waste** which is **left in bins on Gurnard Green**. Please note these bins can be (and are regularly) ransacked by the local widlife, and again I ask that rubbish is either taken home, and as if/ where left by second home owners, owners please subscribe to the collection plus service. Egypt Esplanade was recently pressure washed to remove algae/ slime.

A request has been to Gurnard Pines make safe the **fence** on its boundary with Cockleton Lane.

A request was made to remove a shopping trolley left on Gurnard Green.

I've requested the **replacement of trees** removed from Worsley Road, Place Road and Solent View Road.

Overfilled dog bins in Northwood Recreation Ground have been reported to Island Roads for emptying.

Because it is not categorised as an 'essential service', the IW Council has closed Lynnbottom Tip. I have requested the Council promotes alternative provision until the Tip reopens.

English Coastal Path: Isle of Wight Section.

Consultation as stated on the Isle of Wight section of the English Coastal Path.

In Gurnard proposals include:

The permitted path, at the bottom of Horn Hill, Rew Street connecting to CS17 from/ to Thorness

Footpaths CS35 and CS36 seaward (inc. the sea wall) of Marsh Road.

A direct path through Spencer's Copse to the beach, and onward to the beach huts via Shore Path.



Local Access Forum.

Following winter storms a number of **public rights of way temporarily closed**. This include the steps to Alum Bay, and footpaths to Headon Warren, Forelands, Brook, Brambles Chine and Swains Road.

It was reported that Footpath CS35 at Gurnard was closed, and has now reopened.

With the onset of the **Tour of Britain** later this summer, and by the fact that the Isle of Wight will bookend the tour in September it was hoped that pressure would be in place to upgrade those roads being used by cyclists.

The Ramblers Association and the Rights Of Way Department are seeking volunteers to **check rights of way** each year. Please let me know if you are interested.

Concerns were raised regarding the issuing of **permits for 4x4 users using the Tennyson Trail.** A meeting was due to discuss with the police.

Floodlighting: Ward Avenue.

A meeting was arranged with Environmental Health concerning Floodlight spillage, noise and issues concerning the 3G pitch. Following the meeting, some key questions were raised. These included:

Concerns over the soft landscaping/ arboretum and woodland conditions not being in place.

Why is all lighting on at all times- even when pitches are not in use. Can this be restricted?

Of the three pitches, why is the one closest to Ward Avenue the most frequently used. Can use be rotated?

Can floodlights have 'hoods'/screens to prevent spillage?

Can the potency of lighting be reduced?

Why is lighting turned on at a time when natural lighting is good?

Can there be a waiting area. As the current land in use is creating a noise nuisance to neighbours?

Can the raised areas surrounding the pitch be restricted, as tis impacts upon the privacy and amenity? Can the school's playing field be used during the summer to prevent disturbance?

Also This Month.

The extension to **Bucklers View**, has been delayed following reported drainage concerns. In addition to procuring future housing association developments (and coronavirus) it seems no development is likely to commence before 2021.

I am supporting the Management Company of the Flats at the Green, Crossfield Avenue to resolve planning issues.

An 'abandoned' motorcycle has been reported.

I am supporting the requirement of suspending licensing applications for small businesses during the Coronavirus outbreak.




