Aim and Objectives

Aim of the plan:

To enable community support, self-help and resilience when faced with an emergency situation in conjunction with the Isle of Wight Council.

Objectives of the plan:

- 1.** To conduct a risk assessment, identify hazards and possible mitigation
- 2.** To identify vulnerable groups within the community
- 3.** To identify key contacts
- 4.** To identify a community emergency management team
- 5.** To identify resources available to the community in the event of an emergency

- Contact the IW Council Emergency Management Team (see contact sheet)
- Use the suggested log sheet at the back of the plan to record:
 - Any decisions you have made
 - Who you spoke to and what you said
- Contact other members of the Community that need to be alerted:
 - Those specifically under threat
 - The Parish Council via the Parish Clerk
 - Volunteers and key holders that may be needed

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Contact initially may be to inform them of the emergency or inform them of current Emergency Service advice regarding any action to be taken.
