A LETTER FROM ALL SAINTS'

Good morning.

The Island's motto is *All this beauty is of God*. The Bible tells us a lot about creation, and in Jesus, God reveals himself and his love to us, so that we, and the rest of his creation may eventually be as he intends us to be. The parables of Jesus use the everyday flowers, fields, birds, other animals and seasons to tell his listeners "The Kingdom of God is like this." St John starts his gospel echoing the "In the beginning," of Genesis, the Word made flesh, dwelling among us, is the Word spoken over the deep and darkness, who called all things into being and declared them to be very good.

In Revelation, Jesus says, "Behold, I make all things new, I am the Alpha and the Omega." In the description of the new creation, images from Genesis are taken up and restored; the Tree of Life whose leaves are for "the healing of the nations," the Rivers of the waters of life, the fact that the City has no need of lamp or sun because the Lord God is its light. God's creation will be as he intends.

Our Creator wants us be at one with the rest of creation but all too often we see the natural world as something to be exploited, forgetting that we are part of God's creation. Like all living creatures we are given life as a gift. We are made in the image and likeness of God, and this implies that we are co-creators, to tend and provide for and sustain creation. Churches sometimes fail to uphold this vital part of the Gospel. It was not always like this.

St Gregory the Great, writing in the 11th century, tells us that we contain "something of the angels, something of the birds, something of the flowers, something of the stones."

We are stewards of God's creation. Medieval Benedictine monks had a sustainable forestry policy, trees felled had to be replaced, not simply because the forest was an economic resource, but because they had a sense of their rootedness in the earth. The eastern churches have always had a regard for creation in their theology and worship. The theology and prayer of the celtic church is grounded in the land, sea and sky of which we are a part. We are to be at one not only with our creator, but also with the rest of his creation.

To think that humans are superior to and of more value before God than the rest of Creation is a false distinction and to misunderstand the truth of the scriptures and what Christian writers have said over the centuries. We can give meaning, as Genesis tells us, to all we perceive, and should see ourselves as the responsible partner in the ongoing work of creation and redemption. Creatures belong with us in the same family of God. Our neglect and misuse of creation is a betrayal of God's Creative Plan, and of ourselves. Acknowledging God as our creator, we do well to remember those words from Genesis:

"And God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good."

Gurnard Village Hall continues to thrive as a hub of activity for the local community. As well as the numerous regular user groups, the hall is frequently booked for private parties and other events including the welcome return of 2 weekends of Open Studios Art Exhibitions. The garden has shrubs and trees, seating and picnic tables and is very well maintained. Visitors frequently comment very positively on how smart, clean and well maintained the hall is. The Notice Board on Worsley Road/ Westbrook Lane gives a list of the hall users and upcoming events. Despite the difficult times, the fees of £12/hour for regular or £15/hour for single bookings have not been increased. If you wish to make a booking, please contact Liz Bail gyhabookings@outlook.com

The kitchen has been cleared and provides a wide range of crockery, glasses, cutlery and utensils for hall users and a new water heater. A full Health and Safely Review has been carried out and all recommendations are being implemented.

The Village Hall Association is currently supporting the Chrysalis charity (chrysalisuganda.org) started in 2007 by an IoW woman. Supported by the Methodist minister in Arreton, who personally transports lightly worn old and new bras to Ugandan women to enable them to set up businesses, and support the health and well-being of girls and women. A woman is less likely to be raped if she is wearing a bra. The Hall is open on a Tuesday morning for donations.

The book table has been reintroduced and provides a variety of donated books and magazines for visitors, for a donation. The book stock has been refreshed and can now take further donations.

During the August closure, the hall has been cleaned, minor repairs undertaken to windows and floor and improvements made. These include better access for the disabled with the addition of a handrail to the external steps and smoother access to the building and garden for wheelchairs and mobility scooters.

Future plans include the provision of a fridge, the hanging of a new tapestry, made by the Spinney Quilters to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and an eco/recycling event for the local community to promote understanding. The hall

Calls have been received concerning walked in Parkhurst Forest being poisoned. This follows incidents a couple of years ago, where a number of dogs fell ill, following being walked from Marks Corner. Please be on your guard! The police has been notified. In the meantime, all instances should be reported direct to the police, and please let me know if you or somebody that you know experienced similar instances.

Local Planning Matters:

- Officers visited a chalk based track to the south of Cockleton Farm. To note, this track led to a brick works, and has been upgraded to give access to a landlocked piece of agricultural land.
- Planning Enforcement support was requested over concerns raised over the location of mobile homes at Sunnycott Caravan Park which are for sale. In response, licensing and planning advise it is 'not be expedient to take action' whilst units are for sale.

- A resident has contacted me with concerns over water resilience and conservation, and the inability of water companies to build reservoirs. This is a matter I've taken up with the Council's Environment & Sustainability Forum.
- The latest proposal to develop north of Gurnard Farm was refused by the Planning Inspector.

Tayla Wright.

I met with the family of dancer, Tayla, who tragically passed away last year and would have celebrated her 15th Birthday on 10th September. This meeting followed feedback about discarded cellophane and plastics being left adjoining Tayla's Bench, adjacent to the Beach Huts on Gurnard Seafront.

The anti-social use of jet-ski's at Gurnard was reported to the Marine Police, who continue to monitor waters frequented by bathers. Please note a bye-law exists which prohibits all 'personal watercraft' being used faster than 8 knots and in depths of less than 2 metres.

Barbecues.

The IW Council are supporting calls for disposable barbecues to be discarded sensibly. If disposable barbecues can be avoided all together this would be brilliant! Please ensure debris is safely disposed of. Incidents have occurred where abandoned barbecues has caused fires to surrounding countryside as well as plastic litter bins. There have also been incidents where barbecues have scorched ground where they are been lit, whilst on beaches barbecues has caused burns when trodden on. In response to the regularity of incidents requests have been made to formally ban

disposable barbecues.

No Cold Calling Stickers.

There are currently No Cold Calling stickers that I have left in Cowes Library. In addition, following a resident's complaint, I have also left copies of Southern Vectis' bus timetable in the library.

Highways and Environmental Issues Issues.

- I have requested a replacement of the lost lifebelt from Princes Esplanade, Gurnard.
- Following complaints from residents, Queens Road planting took place.
- I continue to receive complaints over vehicles using the Green, Crossfield Avenue as a Car Park.
- I am supporting disabled residents requiring enhanced support accessing rubbish tips.
- The seawall and pavement opposite the New Holmwood Hotel is due to be repaired by 28th August.
- I have requested the repainting of faded double yellow lines in Shore Road.
- I am supporting residents in Shore Path in receiving Grant Funding to repair the sea wall.
- Last month a burst water main in Northwood Recreation Ground was fixed. I am working with Cllr John Nicholson to see repairs made good to the access road to Northwood Cricket Club.
- Complaints were received concerning where Marsh Road meets Rew Street.
 Unless parking problems are resolved, it may be necessary to request double yellow lines to allow high sided vehicles to pass.
- A request has been made to remove a concrete block which miraculously appeared on Gurnard Beach.
- I continue to receive feedback on overgrown hedges. Please continue to let me know of problem areas.

Island Roads were asked to cut back the larger beds along Worsley Road for safety reasons. Self-seeded ash and bay are a problem and will need further intervention but the ground is too hard to do any further work on the beds yet.

Appeal for building north of Gurnard Farm

The planning appeal for the site north of Gurnard Farm (on Lower Church Road) has been turned down. This is a hugely important decision as, if it had been approved, the Gurnard Neighbourhood Plan would have been completely undermined. It is thanks to our GNP that the Luck Valley is protected and this part of Gurnard is left unspoilt.

Autumn Walking Festival

This festival will take place in October between Saturday 8th and Sunday 16th.

Beach Digger

Several concerned residents contacted councillors or the clerk about the big digger on the 'Secret' beach in an area where slipper clay makes the beach particularly unstable. The Chair, in his IW Councillor report, stated that photographs were taken before Storm Eunice struck and once damage to the seawall has been repaired, the beach should be restored to its original state and boulders replaced both on the beach and in front of the sea wall. Checks that all required permissions had been obtained were made. If residents and property owners could give the Chair or PC clerk advance notice of such works being under-taken, it would save many other locals concern.

Beach Working Party and Southern Water.

There was plenty of discussion about the focus of the Beach Working Group. A recent RNLI Report raised several beach safety concerns but IWC needs to respond first as the report was commissioned by them. However, Personal Water Craft (PWC) particularly jet skis and windsurf foils in the swimming area, are causing concern to locals. If you believe there have been breaches of the relevant byelaw such concerns should be reported to Hampshire Constabulary, whose Marine Police Unit patrols and enforces this.

The area covered by byelaws under section 76 of the Public Health Act 1961 for the prevention of danger, obstruction or annoyance to persons bathing in the sea or using this area extends from the "easternmost point of Gurnard Green to Hamstead Ledge from the high water mark to 200m out to sea so all of Gurnard main beach and the 'Secret' beach is covered by this byelaw.

Two councillors have recently attended a workshop with Southern Water. The need to look at water quality and the reduction of pollution from the two combined sewer overflows (CSOs) on our beaches is obviously very important to many residents so water quality will be the Beach Working Group's immediate focus. Councillors are looking into conducting tests on water quality to enhance the work of the Environment Agency. We look forward to inviting members of the public to be involved with this group as soon as we are able to make constructive use of your valuable time. If you have an interest, please do share your name and contact details plus any particular area of concern or expertise, by emailing Cllr Franklin on Mark.Franklin@gurnardpc.co.uk, ideally before the GPC meeting on 14th September.

Water is a concern in other ways too. The climate crisis is beginning to bite: extreme heat was experienced across the UK in July, a heatwave in August, this season without rain is the longest since 1976. The hosepipe ban introduced on Friday 5th August will last into September and possibly beyond as the rivers Test and Itchen will need to recover before the ban is lifted. We can help ourselves by using water as sensibly as possible and using some of the habits our grandparents and parents used to employ: have a bucket beside the sink for used dishwater and syphon off bath water for watering your garden, use a bucket and sponge if you have to wash the car.

An additional concern is that rain, when it comes may be torrential and it will just run off parched earth and cause more problems. It is run-off which can results in more discharges from CSOs. Southern Water's Pathfinder scheme is promising that free water butts will be provided, hopefully in the Spring, but if you can manage to fit a water butt somewhere on your gutter system then please do consider this as soon as possible, and take up Southern Water's offer later! Contrary to some beliefs there is no restriction to water butts on your property and DEFRA and the Environment Agency recommend their installation in gardens.

Defibrillators in the Village

There are three defibrillators in the village, at the Woodvale, in the Village Hall and beside Gurnard Press. The one at Gurnard Press has a damaged housing and it might be better to find an alternative site for this defibrillator. This will be an agenda item in September.

Environment

There were many reports about the Environment for councillors to consider with one asking, 'What can local councils do to help create a sustainable environment?' A report back from a Southern Water Workshop highlighted the forecast that by 2040 South East England (which includes the IOW) will be facing a one billion litre per day shortfall in water. GPC's Environment Policy is due for review in September and that is important as this aspect of council responsibility is growing fast.

The LCWIP was formally adopted along with a request that future transport planning should give more priority to the mobility impaired.

Old School Meadow

In this dry weather it is vital that all users of the OSM take notice of the NO FIRES order. It would be sensible to avoid smoking there too; one spark or carelessly discarded cigarette could cause a conflagration. Please be aware! There are one or two dog owners who are not picking up after their dogs when visiting the OSM. It is an offense to fail to clean up after your dog. There are bins for disposal of poo bags at the vehicle entrance gate and the bottom of Hilton Road. Please will all dog owners be vigilant and if necessary remind visiting dog owners that Cllr Bustin kindly ensures emergency bags are available from the box at the vehicle entrance gate. In this public space, it is not good enough to kick excrement to the edges of the meadow or fail to remove it.

On a more happy note, a fruit tree specialist has been asked to provide a quotation for managing the community orchard. There are no plums this year and it was probably badgers and foxes which benefitted most from the cherries but there are some apples and blackberries available for residents to pick. Please take fruit carefully: some of the trees are old and fragile.

Spencer's Copse

Work on trees and other aspects of the wood has put the copse out of access at times over the Summer. This was advertised. GPC will try to keep you fully informed if future work requires closure.

Toilets on the Green

The public toilets, management, cleaning and maintenance, are a major item of expenditure for GPC as the council pays for the toilets to be cleaned twice a day over the Summer. The council does its best to ensure these important amenities are kept to a high standard and it is a cause of real concern when these standards fall: sometimes a closure is due a fault on a system or a power cut but sometimes it is vandalism. Blocking the doors open with a stone or trying to force locks can result in the toilets not being available when they are needed. If you do find the toilets in an unacceptable condition there is a 24 hour helpline number displayed on the notices at the toilet block.

Tour of Britain

The Tour route extends through quite a lot of the village so residents will have the chance to enjoy a major sporting event on Sunday September 11th. Please look out for how you can get involved in a land art competition if the idea proves viable. Check for posters on the GPC notice board and social media and community groups may get involved. Meanwhile look out your bunting!


