

## A LETTER FROM ALL SAINTS' HELLO THERE!

I hope you are all well despite the dark evenings and the wintery weather! Walking through Northwood's churchyard a month or so ago I met a lovely lady who had come from the mainland to locate a relative's gravestone. 'I want to remember my relative' she said as we moved to the area where the memorial was located. 'I completely understand' I said as I showed her the stone she had been searching for and told her that I would be in the church should she need anything further and left her to her reflections.

The thing is she wouldn't actually REMEMBER her relative as he died probably 150 years before she was born and yet 'remember' is the word she and indeed we all use when we want to pay respects to someone who has died. We say in our Remembrance Services, it is said at the Albert Hall and up and down our Country – We will remember them. And yet the personal memories of those who died in the first and now even the second world wars are getting few and fewer as the years roll on.

As well as Remembrance Day and Remembrance Sunday, we also have All Souls Day on 2<sup>nd</sup> November when the Church of England remembers and give thanks for all the departed.... we actually have our thanksgiving services nearer Christmas in Northwood and Gurnard as I feel losing someone is felt so much more in the Christmas season. However, it is not just the Church of England that

commemorates those who have died on 2<sup>nd</sup> Nov - the people of Mexico also do!

As you may have seen advertised around the island or on the ferries Robin Hill had a Festival of the Dead, last month over the Half term break. Known in Spanish as 'El Día de los Muertos', this unofficial but widely observed holiday is celebrated on November 2nd each year and focuses on remembering family members and friends who have passed away. While it's strange for most of us to accept the fact that "death" and "festivities" can go hand-in-hand, for most Mexicans, the two are intricately entwined. This all stems from the ancient indigenous peoples of Mexico who believed that the souls of the dead return each year to visit with their living relatives - to eat, drink and be merry. Just like they did when they were living.

And in a way I think remembering their loved ones like this is a healthy thing – after all, as the famous saying goes death is one of only two things that are certain.... along with taxes!

But remembering this year will still be different. Some of our focus may be turned to remembering the heroes of our Special Forces unit, the SAS, as the new drama began last Sunday. Based on true events and the bestselling book of the same name, the show 'SAS Rogue Heroes' is a dramatised account of how the SAS was formed under extraordinary circumstances in the darkest days of World War Two. This is the exhilarating story of renegade men

taking monumental risks in extraordinary circumstances and how one of the most feared and respected fighting units of the world began in Cairo in 1941. More rebels than soldiers, David Stirling's team are every bit as complicated, flawed and reckless as they are astonishingly brave and heroic.... I am certainly looking forward to watching it!

For others, particularly those of you who have welcomed our Ukraine friends into their homes in recent months, Remembrance this year will include the everyday citizens of Ukraine who left their normal jobs and have donned military clothing and picked up weapons to fight Russian soldiers on their land and continue to this day.

And then, of course, we will remember the death of our dear Queen and how she was present at virtually every Cenotaph parade during her 70 years. It will certainly be very poignant when we see King Charles leading the Remembrance Day parade this month.

Time continues, so many things change and yet the concept of Remembrance remains a constant. And so it should. Whether it is a family Remembrance of a dear one on the anniversary of their death, our town remembering the Blitz of Cowes on that fateful night in May 1942 or the country remembering the fallen on 11 November: We must remember, otherwise their deaths would have been in vain. They died loving us or loving their country and we must never forget. As the Chinese writer Ba Jin wrote, 'Only by not forgetting the past can we be the masters of the future.'

Let us do their memories justice and go out into our towns and churches this month, remembering them with thankful hearts

#### Street Clutter.

A few years ago, Island Roads were seeking to reduce and remove unnecessary signage and other street clutter. Several years on, I know there remains signage still in place that is no longer in use. If you know of any signs, please let me know.

#### Old School Meadow.

Following calls of anti-social behaviour, I met some youngsters at Old School Meadow. When I visited them in fairness, I saw no evidence of anything of concern. To note this open space is available to all and it is important that all residents respects this area which is set aside for the community!

#### Island Planning Strategy

The new Planning Bible for the Island was not accepted by Councillors at Full Council in October. The reason for this being that many IW Councillors are unhappy with outdated data which Planning Authorities are obliged by Government to use when assessing annual housing figures.

In light of this vote, I continue to work with Councillors to find solutions. I am taking advantage of the time to see whether more can be done to focus more on prioritising social housing, which is of real concern to some members.

#### Trees and Hedgerows.

 Concerns were raised to the extent landowners cut overgrowth on the paths adjoining Gurnard Heights

- Tree works took place at Gurnard Pines. Although permits were not required the arboriculturalist was in dialogue with the IW Council's Tree Team.
- I received a complaint concerning garden waste being deposited in roadside bins. If you, or somebody you know have issues getting rid of waste let me know or call 823777. If you receive payment for undertaking this work the punishment can be more extreme!

#### Anti-Social Parking, Gurnard School.

Please don't block accesses and driveways when collecting children from Gurnard School. Sadly, this has resulted in altercations with residents unable to leave and access properties in **Baring Road**, **Battery Road**, **Woodvale Road** and **The Dottens**. Please note obstructing accesses can result in police action and was the reason that parking restrictions became more onerous for motorists last year.

#### Southern Inshore Fisheries and Conservation Authority (SIFCA)

One of the organisations that as an IW Councillor I am a member of is SIFCA. SIFCA is funded by Government and Councils to police, monitor fishing and its impact upon the marine environment. The organisation also has a responsibility to introduce bye-laws to support conservation and fisheries.

At its meeting the fishing community raised concerns over commercial fishing's impact. In addition divers, expressed concern over discarded nets and their impact.

## Gurnard 100 Parish Council

### **Gurnard Parish Council Report October 2022**

The September meeting had to be delayed following the death of Her Majesty, the Queen. We met on the 28<sup>th</sup> September in what felt like a different world. There is a new King and a new Prime Minister, Autumn and dark evenings have crept up on us and rain

has fallen although the drought restrictions are still in place, as are worries about the cost of heating our homes and feeding our families: a strange new world with many of the same concerns.

Our energetic and hard working Environment Officer opened with a comprehensive and useful report. Senad is someone who can help with concerns such as graffiti or other forms of inconsiderate behaviour around the parish. Out of the inevitable list of planning applications one was incomprehensible. Either there is a need for councillor training or perhaps the focus should be on applicants, architects or consultants ensuring plans are clear. Worryingly Southern Water comments are generic and include no consideration of the cumulative impact of development on the overloaded sewer system. Many Gurnard residents are concerned by combined sewer overflows (CSOs) mis-use; the lack of any adequate testing regime means there is insufficient data on water quality. A council Beach Safety Working Party will be reconvened soon, aim is to include the Environment Officer, a Gurnard Sailing Club representative, a regular swimmer and an Environment Agency representative. Water testing can be set up locally but it is very expensive and the council needs to be sure it is using your money effectively.

There were many other items discussed: a survey on the seven seafront benches, minor incidents of anti-social behaviour (the biggest concerns being the lighting of fires) and the possibility of a Forest School opening.

At the next meeting, barely a fortnight later on 12<sup>th</sup> October, there were again a number of planning applications and it was helpful that most could be easily understood, just one was ambiguous. If you believe you will be affected, whether positively or adversely, it is always a good idea to send in a comment to the IWC Planning site, a traditional letter or an on-line comment is equally useful as a guide for your local councillors.

The Chairman's report and other agenda items considered anti-social behaviour that has been experienced in the village. Unpleasant littering and graffiti, inconsiderate noise levels: not keeping dogs under proper control or not disposing of bags of dog poo properly are, sadly, recurring problems. Lighting fires where they are forbidden will be less appealing as winter sets in but the over-turning of planters at the junction of Church Road with Worsley Road was more offensive. The very positive response from some residents in putting the planters back so quickly helped. Perhaps the formation of a new group to support Gurnard in Bloom and other local environmental and sustainability goals can harness this community

response and grow our village greener. The council decided not to attempt to anchor the existing planters more firmly as some damage has been caused. Perhaps new planters or alternative designs are needed; these could be planned for the future and in the meantime we hope to enjoy the lovely pansies and other plants for a while longer.

The defibrillator on the wall adjoining Gurnard Press is not easily accessible and the provision of both a new location and external casing for this important village asset are being explored.

An 'open letter' requesting the Island MP look carefully at supporting the Climate and Ecology Bill was unanimously agreed and will be available to all residents on the council noticeboard, local social media and the GPC website via this link: <a href="https://www.gurnardpc.co.uk/wp-content/uploads/2022/10/Bob-Seely-MP.docx.pdf">https://www.gurnardpc.co.uk/wp-content/uploads/2022/10/Bob-Seely-MP.docx.pdf</a> The letter makes clear the concern GPC has about the continued, excessive use of CSOs on Gurnard Beach. Several councillors supported the demonstration held on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> where about 100 people met to protest against pollution of our beach and seawater. A simple survey consulting on the seven Welcome Back benches was carried out asking the question of whether users are happy with the seat positions or not. Following that Cllrs Bugden, Acton , Nolan and Franklin counted the responses. Out of the 38 slips returned: One was spoiled: Twenty six liked the current position: Eleven were not happy with the seats' position. As there was a big majority in favour of the seats in their current positions the council is happy with the very clear result.

A fruit tree specialist will be employed to give some care to the long neglected community orchard in Old School Meadow (OSM) with the impact reviewed at the end of the first year. GPC hope this will lead to an improved community asset and further care and possible community days may be part of future consultation. The crab apple tree ordered early in the year for planting as part of the Queen's Green Canopy will be planted soon by Gurnard resident, Mr Bert Jupe; he has helped care for the tree for months (waiting for a suitable planting window over a summer of drought) and is going to take care of watering it as necessary until it is established. Planting date and time tbc.

How to get signs advertising village amenities, their possible design, location and wording, were discussed at length. It is not possible to have a brown tourist sign due to limited village parking but enquiries about an alternative sign, the wording, location(s) and cost are being made with an aim of supporting our village businesses.

Safety concerns on Baring Road and junctions (inappropriate /dangerous parking and some excessive speed at school drop off or pick up times) were discussed. Central funding for a lollipop person is no longer available but may come from parish or town councils. An Island wide review of road and speed limits is

currently underway but Baring Road is not currently seen as a priority. GPC will contact the Research about the potential for opening a Community Pantry in the village has been under-taken but it may not be effective use of funds to open a discrete village pantry, instead supporting the Cowes food bank and backing the IWC Warm Spaces initiative might be more effective. Cllr Fuller advised the IWC are providing 'air fryers' (cheaper cooking method than an oven) and a summary of what else is on offer will be made available as soon as possible. A listing of **Warm Spaces** available in the village will be compiled. Some events may carry a charge or request a donation, but all will offer, as well as a warm space, the chance to meet with people and enjoy some refreshment. GPC encourages residents to support 'warm space' events by donating cakes if they can. If there is a need, the council could potentially help in renting space from local venues to hold additional events. GPC representation at, and a Royal British Legion donation for, the Remembrance Service Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> November were agreed.
