A LETTER FROM ALL SAINTS'



HELLO THERE!

So, this is it, my final parish mag article! When I wrote my first article back in March 2013, did I expect that I would still be here 10 and a half years

later? Definitely not. That first year was so difficult, you could even say traumatic, and yet God has kept us safe and carried us through all the ups and downs! In my first article I wrote 'With the new job, there has been a move to the island and with that comes many new things – new people to meet, a new place to live and places to learn how to get to (will we ever understand the Newport one way system!?!), new nurseries for the children, new friends to make....the list is endless!' Amusingly I don't know which one way system in Newport was confusing me back then and I smiled as our move in August will bring virtually the same concerns for Team Collinson – we will have new schools, a new job, a new community to join and the task of finding new friends again! The only advantage we have over our last move to Cowes is that this move to Fareham will bring us closer to our families – we will only be 20 minutes away from both sets of parents and siblings, whereas it has been around a 2-hr journey from the island. That makes our hearts sing family is so important to us!

But over these 10 years you have embraced us as family. Despite being told at my interview meet and greet that I will never be an islander, (it was from a dear parishioner, a true-blood islander, whom with we became good friends,

despite my foreign ways!) we have felt very settled here. For our boys, living the majority of their lives here, this is the only home they know! We have been blessed with the most wonderful people to work with, live in community with, share our lives with, welcomed into our home and been welcomed into theirs. We have also been blessed with the place – when they were younger, our boys thought that every school had a beach around the corner: Whatever we wanted - a beach to swim, SUP or windsurf on; a forest to explore; glorious hills to walk up and down; beautiful countryside to cycle, the island has provided. And we have lived in the most amazing house - a refuge during lockdown; host for our annual church BBQ; a family and friends bolthole for gatherings, BBQs and jugs of Pimms; a place for various football games, badminton tournaments, archery events, mini-Olympics games and until recently cricket matches (the boys hit too hard now and we have given up trying to find the ball in the surrounding fields/ trees/hedges!)

I am so very thankful for all of this, so much so that my message to you all today is - DON'T TAKE WHAT YOU HAVE FOR GRANTED! Will we ever live in a more beautiful and amazing home? No. Will we find better, more pastoral schools than our local ones, particularly the ones our boys have gone to? Very unlikely. Will we find better football and cricket teams for our children to join? I don't think so. We will ever be in such a close-knit community again? Hmmm, this may happen, well I pray it does!

But then will we ever find a better burger than The Cow's? Will we ever find a more conscientious, hard work and super value for money than Mark Coburn Ltd? Absolutely not. Will I ever find a more tolerant hairdresser than Jo from Jo's Salon? Sadly no. I literally could go on for pages...... this island has so, so many wonderful things!

The band James famously sang a song called 'Sit Down' which includes the lyrics 'If I hadn't seen such riches, I could live with being poor'. We have had so many 'riches' over the years, that we will, without doubt, struggle to not regularly reminisce about our time here on this beautiful island.... But when you are in the mix of things, when times are hard, when the future is uncertain, you don't necessarily realise how lucky you are. But as the hymn written by Johnson Oatman in 1897 says 'Count your blessings, name them one by one. Count your blessings, see what the Lord has done.'

What has the Lord done? He sent me here to Cowes with a husband and two babes in arms, when I didn't want to come. And now he has told me to move, when we, my amazing husband and awesome young men, don't want to leave! The Good Lord works in mysterious ways, but I know I am doing the right thing, despite how hard it is.

Thank you for the past 10 years, thank you for embracing me as your priest, thank you for giving me the privilege to walk with you and your families during the joyous times of baptisms and weddings and the tragic times of deaths, expected and unexpected. Thank you for your cups of tea, slices of cake, large Baileys, little gifts, kind words of encouragement, support, energy....the list is endless.

Whilst the prayer on the front is called a 'Parting Blessing', I

am not going to say goodbye, instead I will say 'farewell', as I will be returning to the island with my new job, accompanying the Bishop when he comes over here, and I am sure we will be back as a family – to



see dear friends, watch talented ones in concerts or just so the boys can go around for hours on the Tapnell Go Karts!

Report from Paul Fuller, Independent Isle of Wight Councillor for Cowes West & Gurnard.

During August I hold fewer surgeries. This is because fewer residents contact me during the summer break. Please note, it may take longer to deal with and resolve issues due to staff leave. From my perspective, I will be out and about throughout this time and will pick up texts, phone calls and emails.

CAR PARKING.

A number of residents contacted me concerning the cost of car parking on the Island. New charges were introduced following last year's budget and consultation. Although residents were not in full support, views expressed showed that increases were preferable to services being cut back further. That said, I have sympathy with the increased costs, and asked that if costs were more affordable this could result in more people paying less thus, retaining revenue. What concerns me further is that charges seem higher on the Island than in comparative mainland areas. For me, what is increasingly important is the need to incentivise residents using local shops.

SCHOOL PLACEMENTS.

Thank you to the residents and teachers who contacted me regarding proposals put forward regarding future school placements in the Cowes area.

This comes about as a result of falling pupil numbers nationally and particularly within the Island. Over five years pupil numbers are due to fall by about one third. This in turn, will result in schools struggling to balance books at a time of rising costs and schools recruiting staff.

FULL COUNCIL.

I was reappointed to hold my Cabinet position as Councillor responsible for Planning and in addition am also taking on Coastal Protection, Flooding as well as responsibilities for Parish Councils.

To note, the Council and Alliance administration does not hold a majority on the IW Council, and therefore more it is important to work with Councillors of all persuasions.

GRASS VERGES.

To save the IW Council money, grass verges are now cut to the statutory minimum. For this reason, I have chased up verge cuts in locations where foliage has seemingly gone crazy, following spells of rain.

NOISE COMPLAINTS.

I continue to receive complaints regarding noise nuisance. Although I am happy to assist on this, Environmental Health asks that residents email them direct: environmental.health@iow.gov.uk, or call 01983 821000. This ensures officers can fully understand the harm anti-social behaviour impacts. In the meantime, to assist please keep a log of incidents and when (and where) they occur.

LITTER BINS.

I've continued to monitor bins at Gurnard Green and Seafront. If you cannot take litter home, please leave your rubbish in a bin less full. This assists preventing our lovely badgers and foxes scattering rubbish..

COMMUNITY BUSES.

Promotion is about to start for Community Bus Drivers recruitment. John Berry readily accepted the request to again be poster boy for the campaign. Please let me know if you are interested in volunteering!

GURNARD PINES UPDATE.

Last month I met Mr Prosser at Gurnard Pines. During the meeting, I was shown recently refurbished Gym facilities, function suite plus the office and retail spaces currently available for commercial purposes. I discussed and am hopeful that the shop may reopen..

As Planning Officers seem unhappy with proposal for new Eco-Chalets, I've requested a meeting to discuss proposals. On this dialogue continues. Following noise complaints, Quad bikers were requested to stop using the top field.

I have stepped up pressure on the Royal Mail to replace the Cockleton Lane postbox removed last year.

JET SKI (PERSONAL WATERCRAFT): NEW LEGISLATION.

Legislation is now in place to prevent misuse of watercraft such as jet skis. New Powers that:

Anyone riding a jet ski recklessly or causing harm to others may face up to 2 years in prison and an unlimited fine.

Maritime and Coastguard Agency to be granted more powers to prosecute. In addition the Maritime Police Unit also has powers under local the local bye-law.

BACK DOOR WASTE/ RECYCLING COLLECTIONS.

For second home owners, and those unable to leave their waste out, the Council provides their Collection Plus Service allowing householders to agree a safe collection point for their refuse. For details, visit: https://www.iow.gov.uk/recycling-and-waste/additional-household-services/paid-for-waste-services/ or call: 01983 823777. This service costs £65 per year and free to residents who are mobility impaired.

COASTAL PROTECTION ISSUES.

I have been advise that coastal defences in a 'very poor' condition in Cowes (Queens Road) and Gurnard (Concrete Groynes) are due to repaired in the coming financial year.

Elsewhere following slippage at Gurnard Green the IW Council has agreed to create retention barriers to protect beach huts.

SECOND/ HOLIDAY HOMES.

I continue to receive comments concerning increasing Council Tax levels for Holiday Home and Second Home owners. From feedback received I've had 17 enquiries in favour of implementing this and 6 opposed. Please note that no decision has been made to do this, however Government has consulted on this. In the meantime, for or against let me know your thoughts!

NEW HOMES, COCKLETON LANE- APPROVED.

Permission was granted for 6 dwellings in Cockleton Lane. As a result a permissive path will connect Cockleton Lane to Place Road via Deauville Avenue. As yet, there has been no agreed path to connect paths to Tuttons Hill.

OPPORTUNIST BURGLARIES.

The police has asked for residents to be vigilant by locking sheds and doors are locked. This is requested as unwanted intruders and opportunist burglaries occur during the summer.



Gurnard Parish Council Report July - August 2023

Two concerned members of the public attended the council meeting on 14th June. Their query was not on the agenda so no formal response was possible, however councillors always try to be

receptive to concerns and their query will be followed up

appropriately. Despite a very full agenda ahead, we were pleased that these residents came in to share their worries. Councillors do their best to serve the community even if there are times when the wheels of local government seem to move very slowly or when the needs of parishioners diverge widely and it proves impossible to please all parties. Please look carefully at items where consultations which will be taking place later in the year are flagged up. Please have a think about what is important to you in the village. We are aiming to build on last year's consultation returns (10%) when we ask for your responses this year. This is a report spanning two months so GPC Cllrs would like to give you our best wishes for a lovely Summer break.

Community Emergency Plan and Flood Plan

These plans are in urgent need of up-dating and a working party is to be set up to review them. If you would be willing to work on the plans – possibly on a remote basis – then please email Cllr Penny Acton at pennyacton53@gmail.com The aim will be to have plans revised before the Autumn storms start to come in.

Coronation Wall Hanging

As users of the hall will have seen, a new hanging has been created and is on display to the left of the stage curtains. This commemoration of the Coronation has been designed to complement the Platinum Jubilee wall hanging displayed on the right hand side of the stage wall. These wonderful creations, the work of Spinney Quilters, are striking reminders of two major events of the last year and of a great deal of hard work, thought and care.

Defibrillator Access

There have been queries about how to access the defibrillator outside Buckler's View (a good clear location I'm sure everyone would agree). Anyone needing to use this emergency equipment will have an access code provided once case is opened and 999 dialled. It really is a case of follow the clear instruction, stay calm and carry on!

Exercise of public rights

Documents (financial) which parishioners/ the public have the statutory right to examine will be made available on GPC website and on the GPC noticeboard between the dates of Monday 19th June and Friday 28th July.

No-mow May

Opinions reaching the council about No-mow May have been mixed, councillors'

reaction is equally diverse. The consensus seems to be, however that No-mow May needs thought and planning if the impact is to be a positive one. It cannot be a poorly implemented, ad hoc measure which is a sort of money saving device and this is true for both Old School Meadow and the verges and borders in the village. Queries about wildflower planting have been sent, as have concerns about the village looking 'scruffy' and horror has been expressed at the sun-burnt hayfields which are the result of a rough cut of long, dry grass. There is no quick or easy route to knowing how our little areas of green space should be treated under the increasing impact of climate change, which is raising temperatures and altering rain patterns so much we can no longer ignore it. How we need to use our streets to suit residents and visitors and how want our village to look needs care and thought. This will be an area that is consulted on after the summer, so put your thinking hats on and consider the future. In the meantime a big thank you to all the village residents who are making an effort to plant and bring a little colour and beauty to the streets and water to keep trees and plants alive.

Planning

A relatively easy planning list this month with most items to comment on being variations to applications already considered. Cllrs would like to remind applicants that providing real clarity on what you are hoping to achieve is important. There was little opportunity to discuss either concerns about environmental impact (more hard surfaces etc) or to consider what is happening to the village housing stock, the dearth of genuinely affordable homes for example, but perhaps these points needs to be a longer term discussion as another part of further consultation with residents.

Slow Release Water Butts

The whole point of the Pathfinder Project is to reduce run-off (rain and storm water running off hard surfaces such as roofs) into the foul sewer. Too much run-off into the foul sewer over-whelms the system and triggers use of Combined Sewer Overflows (CSOs) — and there are two of these on Gurnard Beach. Nobody wants to swim in water which may be contaminated by sewage or sit on a beach where there are smells coming up from man-hole covers. Water quality has been a focus for the council's Beach Safety Working Group and the council has supported Southern Water (SW) with the slow release water butts as this is a positive way in which the company is working to tackle a Gurnard priority. The scheme's name clearly indicates that this is a learning situation for everyone and of course it is hard to measure how much impact the scheme is having when there is a long dry spell; feedback will be provided at a future date. Meanwhile the SuDS planters are looking lovely but they are dry.

Some residents are asking why SW has not yet been in contact. Currently a two man SW team is visiting residents door to door, however a team expansion in July will allow the scheme to move faster and calling cards (with a contact email

address) will be left for residents who are not at home. If you know you will not be easy to contact at home during the day, then please use the online form on the GPC website, otherwise please wait patiently; if you are eligible, then SW will get to you. Other homeowners want to know why their road/property is not being included in the water butt scheme, Tilbury Road is an example. Here SW will be working to correct a mis- connection and this means run-off from these homes will not enter the foul sewer and so has no impact on the use of CSOs which is a baseline criteria for eligibility. Residents of Prince's Esplanade have also asked why their homes are not eligible; run-off from these homes is directed to mains drainage but not the foul sewer and so again, there is no impact on CSO use.

Residents who have had a water butt fitted are concerned that the design of the water butts, which have openings on the lid, means they may become breeding grounds for mosquito larvae. Advice from SW is to wipe a little olive oil around the openings and spray a little oil onto the surface of the water. Olive oil is

recommended as it tends to be less smelly and lasts longer in the water but advice is also to clean out fairly frequently. I may be told off for this but I have found that a black plastic plant pot tray with a diameter of 32cm (about size of a garden bucket) sits very easy on top of the lid closing of the openings!
